What happened? How did you feel? Afterwards, when you'd used this skill, how did you feel? Building our ability to reason is a crucial life skill - thank you for sharing your story.

#### What we will be learning...with top learning tips

**Reading...** In Guided Reading we will be learning about different fiction and non-fiction texts, and furthering our comprehension skills. We will explore the features and content of information and fiction texts and answer questions based on the reader's inference and understanding. Reading is vitally important through all subjects and as a life skill, so please make sure that you read with/to your child as much as you can.

**Learning Top Tip** – Word searches and books such as 'Where's Wally' help to improve skim and scan techniques.

**Maths...**We will be reinforcing and extending our number skills: place value, number bonds, column addition and subtraction, multiplication, division, fractions and worded problems will feature. Alongside this, daily practice of our times tables will be happening. We will be making sure we are secure in 2's, 5's and 10's and learning the 3, 4 and 8 x tables. This term will also be full of problem solving, learning new skills and investigations.

**Learning Top Tip** – Knowing your times tables quickly improves how well you can calculate bigger numbers too.

**GRAMMAR** - new curriculum expectations, which children need to know and be able to apply in their writing and reading: prepositions, conjunctions, word family, prefix, clause, subordinate clause, direct speech, consonant letter vowel, inverted commas (or 'speech marks')

**Learning Top Tip** – Remember, punctuation is just as important as the words you use. It tells the reader **how** to read it.

#### What we will be learning...

**Geography\_** We will continue our topic on Rivers. Look out for the Year 3 Home Learning project based on this topic. More details will follow in your child's home learning book and on our class web page.

RE - Christianity linked to the Last Supper and forgiveness.

**PE** - Dance - Monday afternoon and ball skills and Tag Rugby On Tuesday afternoon. 3R swim on Friday.

Jigsaw (PSHCE) -Our topic this term is 'Healthy Me'

**Science** - We will continue our topic on Rocks and Fossils. This will also be linked to an English topic on Why Are Dinosaurs Extinct?

French- On Thursday afternoons, groups of children have a French lesson with Mrs Smith. This term they are learning about the names of the colours.

**Computers:** The children will be sharpening up their word processing skills by creating a fact file on a topic that interests them.

This Fairtrade Focus week, we will be learning about how Fair Trade helps the people that produce the products we know and love. Our foodie focus this year is chocolate!

Did you know Cadbury's Dairy Milk has been Fair Trade since 2009? By 2019 Cadbury's aim to make all of their chocolate products Fair Trade. All year groups will be making delicious Fair Trade treats from banana splits to lemonade, truffles to cupcakes.
